



Faculty Position in Environmental Economics

The University of Michigan's School of Natural Resources and Environment (SNRE) and Program in the Environment (PitE) are seeking to fill a full-time, nine-month, tenure-track Assistant Professor position in Environmental Economics. Applicants should have a Ph.D. in economics, applied and agricultural economics, or a closely related discipline; a research emphasis in environment, energy, or renewable natural resources; and strong empirical skills. Excellence in research and teaching is essential. Demonstrated interest in collaborating across disciplines is a desirable trait. The position is a joint appointment with SNRE and PitE.

Application materials should include a letter of application, statements of research and teaching interests and philosophy, curriculum vitae, up to three publications or working papers, and three letters of reference. Applicants should arrange for the reference letters to be submitted independently.
