Tenure-track Faculty Position (Environment and Sustainable Development)

The Division of Environment invites applications for a tenure-track position in environment and sustainable development. Applicants should possess a PhD degree in one of the following fields: environmental economics, public policy, political science, geography, sustainability sciences, or a related discipline that integrates the environment, sustainable development, social science, and particularly economics. Research interest and experience in Mainland China's environmental issues and challenges would be an asset. The appointee will teach introductory as well as upper level undergraduate and graduate courses, conduct research, and supervise graduate students.

Depending on the applicant's qualifications and experience, appointment will be made at the rank of Assistant Professor or Associate Professor with an initial three-year contract that may be renewed. Appointment may be considered at the level of Associate Professor with substantiation for applicants with exceptionally strong publication records. The position would start as early as July 2011.

Salary is competitive and will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Fringe benefits include annual leave, medical and dental benefits. Housing benefits will also be provided where applicable. For appointment made under contract terms, a gratuity will be payable upon successful completion of contract.
