Advances in Integrated Assessment Modeling

Integrated assessment models (IAMs) play a crucial role in the policy design process for many environmental concerns, including climate economics and estimates of local air pollution impacts. Led by David Anthoff (University of California, Berkeley), Elizabeth Kopits (U.S. Environmental Protection Agency), Frances C. Moore (University of California, Davis), and Nicholas Z. Muller (Carnegie Mellon University), the AERE 2019 Pre-Conference Workshop will combine lectures with practical hands-on sessions.


EARLY BIRD REGISTRATION ENDS APRIL 19, 2019 - SAVE 50!

An exciting update from the Editors of the Journal of the Association of Environmental and Resource Economists: JAERE is indexed!

JAERE has now been accepted for the Social Sciences Citation Index (SSCI) in two categories: Economics and Environmental Studies. The private firm that maintains the SSCI and calculates journal impact factors will give JAERE its first official impact factor in its June 2020 release. However, even before the impact factor is available, all articles published in JAERE are now indexed in the SSCI.

Note that according to Web of Science citations per article, even in our early years of publication JAERE's citations (2.88 per article) rank favorably with the Journal of Public Economics (2.78 per article), the Journal of Environmental Economics and Management (3.54), the Energy Journal (1.81), and Environmental and Resource Economics (2.27). Additional citation metric comparisons are available on JAERE's website and will be updated as new information becomes available.

AERE members took a leap of faith in establishing this exciting journal, owned by AERE and published by the University of Chicago Press, a non-profit academic press fully committed to AERE's mission. Indexing is a real milestone in JAERE's development as a journal, and it is due to the fantastic content submitted by authors, the hard work of hundreds of referees each year, and the dedication and service of our outstanding team of co-editors. - **AERE@WEAI:** AERE sponsors up to twelve sessions, presenting more than forty research papers, at the Western Economic Association International (WEAI) Annual Conference. This year's conference will be held June 28 - July 2, 2019, at the Hilton San Francisco Union Square in San Francisco, CA. **AERE is an Allied Society of the WEAI so participants in AERE sessions register at the same rate as members of WEAI.**
- **AERE@SEA:** The Southern Economic Association 89th Annual Meeting will be held November 23-25, 2019, at the Marriott Harbor Beach Resort & Spa in Fort Lauderdale, FL. AERE sponsors over a dozen sessions, with more than forty research papers at the SEA Annual Meeting. The abstract submission period has closed.

Call for Dissertation Awards

Nominations are now being accepted for the Wallace E. Oates Outstanding Doctoral Dissertation Award. Nominated dissertations are judged by a panel of AERE members who emphasize in their deliberations the originality of the research, quality of implementation, expositional clarity, and intellectual and practical significance of research findings. Nominees must have completed all the requirements for their doctoral degree by August 15 of the year in which they are being considered for the award, which includes acceptance of the final and complete dissertation by the nominee's university (the degree may be officially conferred in a graduation ceremony at a later date, usually no later than the end of the calendar year). The award is given at the AERE Luncheon and Business Meeting held each year at the Allied Social Science Associations (ASSA) annual meeting in early January. The winner receives a \$1,500 cash award along with a \$500 travel grant to attend a recognition ceremony at the luncheon. The winner's dissertation abstract is also published in the Journal of the Association of Environmental and Resource Economists (JAERE). [Click here to learn more.](#)

In 2015, the AERE Board of Directors recognized the many distinguished contributions of Wally Oates by naming the AERE Outstanding Doctoral Dissertation Award in his honor and initiating a fund-raising drive to endow the award in perpetuity.

Winners of the Oates Dissertation Award receive a handsome plaque, a \$1,500 cash award, and \$500 in travel support to attend the annual AERE Luncheon and Business Meeting held each January at the Allied Social Science Associations (ASSA) annual meeting to receive the award.

Wally was a seminal figure in the modern field of environmental economics. His book, *The Theory of Environmental Policy*, coauthored with William Baumol, is a classic in the field and was honored by AERE as a Publication of Enduring Quality in 1993. Wally was also an inaugural AERE Fellow and served on the AERE Board from 1983 - 1986. The Oates Memorial Fund supports the annual Wallace E. Oates Outstanding Doctoral Dissertation Award, given each year to the student whose dissertation exemplifies originality in research, quality of implementation, and whose research findings have intellectual and practical significance. Naming the dissertation award in Wally's honor is a fitting and enduring way to honor his memory.
